

1st QUARTERLY ACTIVITY REPORT


On June 20, 2022, the newly created <u>Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner</u> ("OSIC") launched its first phase of operations and Canada's new independent safe sport mechanism became <u>Abuse-Free Sport</u>. The present report provides an overview of the 1st quarter of operations of the OSIC, in terms of key activities and available statistics.

ACTIVITY OVERVIEW

- Onboarded 5 <u>Program Signatories</u>
- Published <u>Universal Code of Conduct to Prevent and Address Maltreatment in Sport</u> version
 6.0 as well as 7 new <u>Policies and Procedures</u>
- Launched <u>Complaint Management</u> process
- Launched Support Services program (<u>Legal Aid Program</u> and <u>Mental Health Support</u> Program)
- Launched Sport Environment Assessment ("SEA") process (see timeline below)
- Launched an Abuse-Free Sport Webinar Series and hosted the "Opening Conversation with the Commissioner"
- Created units of independent investigators & assessors
- Provided services of the OSIC to 6 provincial/territorial delegations and offered services of the Canadian Sport Helpline to all participants during the 2022 Canada Summer Games

QUARTERLY STATISTICS¹

- 56: total number of safe sport related inquiries received by the Canadian Sport Helpline
- 24: total number of complaints/reports received by the OSIC
- 67% of complaints/reports received by the OSIC arising from non-Program Signatories
- 25% of complaints/reports deemed admissible by the OSIC according to OSIC jurisdiction and authority
