

## **QUARTERLY ACTIVITY REPORT**

## For the Period of April 1 to June 30, 2023

This document provides an overview of the 4th quarter of operations of the <u>Abuse-Free Sport</u> program and its different components, including key activities and available statistics of the <u>Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner</u> (OSIC).

## GENERAL ACTIVITY OVERVIEW

- Signed <u>service agreements</u> with an additional **13** federally-funded sport organizations (totalling **86**<sup>1</sup> as of June 30, 2023)
- Published <u>Annotated UCCMS version 1.0</u>
- Accredited two education trainings through the first accreditation cycle of the <u>Abuse-Free Sport</u> <u>Education Accreditation Program</u>:
  - Canadian Centre for Child Protection Commit to Kids for Coaches
  - Coaching Association of Canada Safe Sport Training
- Launched the <u>Abuse-Free Sport Education Library</u>
- Launched the Abuse-Free Sport Program Signatory portal
- Delivered 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarterly Program Signatory Information Session
- Created the Abuse-Free Sport Policy Update Taskforce
- Delivered four Abuse-Free Sport information sessions
- Launched and completed Abuse-Free Sport Organizational Excellence Framework request for proposals

## OSIC QUARTERLY STATISTICS

- 164 safe sport related inquiries received by the Canadian Sport Helpline
- 97 new <u>Complaints</u><sup>2</sup> received by the OSIC
- **35%** (34 of 97) of Complaints within jurisdiction and authority<sup>3</sup>; **9** of 97 with determination pending
- **41%** (22 of 54) of Complaints outside of jurisdiction were referred to an alternate safe sport mechanism/reporting option
- 12 active cases (11 added this guarter) with Provisional Measures in effect on June 30, 2023
- Four Sport Environment Assessments at or beyond the scoping phase as of June 30, 2023

<sup>3</sup> Lack of jurisdiction (54 of 97) due to: (i) Organization listed is a Program Signatory of Abuse-Free Sport, but Respondent is not a participant under the authority of a Signatory (e.g., involved at the club level only); (ii)Organization is not a Signatory; (iii) the matter is unrelated to the UCCMS; or (iv) the Complaint/Report contained inadequate information to proceed (e.g., no Respondent identified) and no method of contacting the Reporter to obtain necessary information was provided.
